Celebrating Achievements

We have many reasons to be very proud of our students, and regular readers of our Newsletter see details of these on a weekly basis. Very often it's their academic performance we celebrate or an achievement linked to the curriculum, but there are a whole range of things that our students excel at that it's easy to become blasé.

In last week's Newsletter, for example we reported how Alderman White students, including the Broxtowe Youth Mayor, Alfie Russell, and the Deputy Youth Mayor, William Mee, played a leading role in the Broxtowe Holocaust Memorial Day ceremony. It is a great honour to have both roles filled by Alderman White students, and the majority of the postholders in the last few years have come from the Federation.

You may also have read in the Nottingham Post last week that an Alderman White student, Max Wright, has been involved in testing and evaluating a breakthrough treatment for asthma at QMC, called the Prolab – as well as giving the benefit of his opinion, Max has donated his birthday present money to raising money for equipment to help sick children – well done Max!

Also in the last week, we have had some amazing news from Bramcote College, who triumphed against some incredibly stiff competition last weekend – thank you to Mr Macdonald for the following report:

Bramcote College - Regional Netball Champions

Bramcote College's Netball Team certainly didn't let the awful wind and rain stop them last weekend at Emmanuel School as they competed in the East Midlands Netball Regional Finals.

Their first group game was against Bannovale School from Lincolnshire in which Bramcote College started slowly before a strong second half saw them win 8-4. They then blitzed Littleover School in their second game 12-6. The third game against Northants High School saw the strength and power of our girls as they held on to win 8-6 which guaranteed them a semi-final spot. Although we lost the final group game against Oakham School this was no more than a dead rubber. The semi-final game itself against Loughborough High School was a nail-biting affair with never more than one score in it. Fortunately the team had played at this stage before and their experience showed as they won a close game 6-5. The final was against Repton School who had beaten Oakham School in the other semi-final. Without a doubt the girls put on their best performance of the year. Once they scored the first goal they never lost the lead and ran out 10-6 winners.



This awesome performance saw the team crowned the East Midlands Netball Champions to add to the County Championship won last term. This means that they will now represent the East Midlands in the national finals over the weekend of March 17th -18th in Welwyn Garden City. It was a real privilege to be there on Saturday and the College is incredibly proud of our girls – they were skilful and competitive on-court but humble and gracious in victory. A particular mention should go to Richard Bateman (recently awarded 'Inspirational Teacher of the Year' in the Nottingham Post's Education Awards for his work with this team) alongside Emma Peebles who has assisted with the coaching. To put their achievement into context, Bramcote College are now ranked as one of the top 18 schools in the country at U16 level out of over 500 entries. The girls are now training for the National Finals – they are determined to not only be the best state school in the country but the best school in the country.



I'd like to thank all the parents, students and staff who came along to support our girls but, most of all, I'd like to commend our girls for becoming Regional Champions. They deserve every bit of credit that comes their way for their achievement. In so many ways they showed all the attributes we want all our students across the Trust to develop and display: **Bravery; Resilience; Attitude; Motivation; Commitment; Organisation; Talent; Energy.** In a word – **BRAMCOTE.**
