Team Work!

It's hard to imagine now, but there was a time when the number of staff in school who weren't teachers was very small – school secretary and caretaker, and possibly a welfare assistant or two. These days, we depend on a fantastic team of staff without whom teaching would be very different, and a lot less effective. Sometimes, they have a much lower profile, but I know that many of you will have had occasion to be grateful for their expertise and care.

Firstly, the staff who work directly with students, primarily teaching assistants and learning mentors. We have a very dedicated and skilled team who support students in many ways – this might be sitting with an individual or group in class, withdrawing them to give additional support, working alongside the class teacher to support learning, or running programmes such as the Individual Mentoring Programme. They are often the people who know our children the best, and are crucial in enabling them to access school successfully.

We have a highly-skilled finance and administration team who work largely behind the scenes. They ensure that things run smoothly, that we manage our budget well, recruit and support staff effectively, deal with a whole host of issues such as pupil data and admissions, communications and liaison with outside agencies, as well as organising day to day admin duties, such as supporting senior leaders, answering the phone and manning Reception, reprographics, organising letters, collecting money and so on.

We have a number of teams who provide support for teachers and students in a range of ways – our specialist librarians, Science and Technology technicians, attendance officers, school nurse, counsellor, EAL (English as an Additional Language) support, exams officers supported by a whole group of invigilators, and our IT team, who provide support for curriculum and for admin.

Last but not least, we have the people who keep us safe, warm and well-fed – our cooks and midday staff, and our site team. They play a vital role in keeping everything up and running, and are often the first to arrive and the last to leave.

In total, there are over 200 full and part-time staff employed across the White Hills Park Federation Trust, and the achievements of our students depend on them all. I am very grateful that we have such a dedicated and hard-working team.

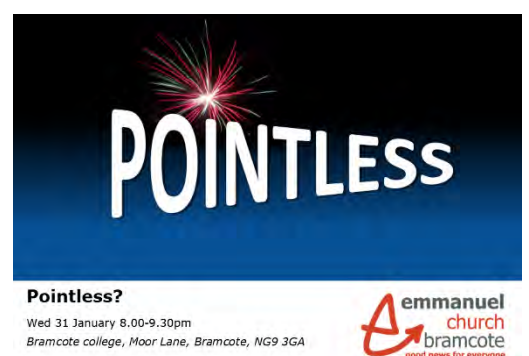

Alderman White Year 9 Students at the Broxtowe Holocaust Memorial Day Ceremony

The Broxtowe Holocaust Memorial Day Ceremony in the Walled Garden in Bramcote Park was a moving reminder of the millions of people who were murdered in the Holocaust and in subsequent genocides across the world. The Deputy Mayor of Broxtowe gave a powerful address on the theme of this year's event, 'The Power of Words'.

Alfie Russell, Broxtowe's Youth Mayor, a Year 9 Alderman White student, read an extract from The Diary of Anne Frank to the assembled congregation - a timeless testimony to the power of words and their ability to have impact on successive generations. William Mee, who is also in Year 9 and is Broxtowe's Deputy Youth Mayor, then read two poems written by Bart Chambers and Katie Taylor about the Holocaust. In total, 12 poems from Ms Scurrah's Year 9 History class have been laminated and displayed in the park for members of the public to view. Not only are we very proud of Alfie's and William's contributions this morning to the ceremony, we are also so impressed with the quality of the writing produced by our Year 9 students. So many members of the community stayed to read our students' work and commented on the poignancy of their writing.
