

## Personal Development

### Curriculum Implementation

All students will cover current events and fundamental life skills as part of the curriculum such as road safety and world news. The students will study 5 themes within their Personal Development Lessons. These themes meet the statutory guidance set out in the Keep Children Safe in Education and help work towards achieving the Gatsby benchmarks (more information on this can be found in the “Careers and post-guidance” section of the website):

Theme A	How can I engage with my community?
Theme B	What are my rights and freedoms?
Theme C	Where can this take me in the future?
Theme D	How can I work online safely, and effectively?
Theme E	How can I maintain a healthy body and mind?
