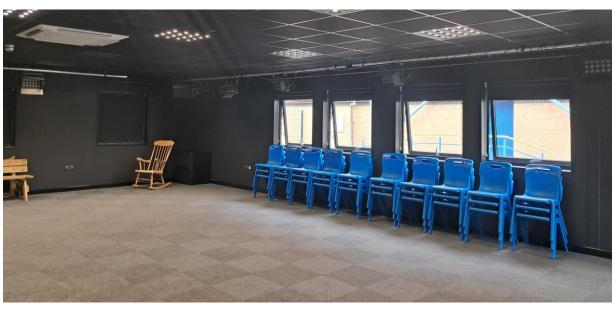

Parent Survey 2024 (178 responses)

- ✓ Range of subjects available (94%)

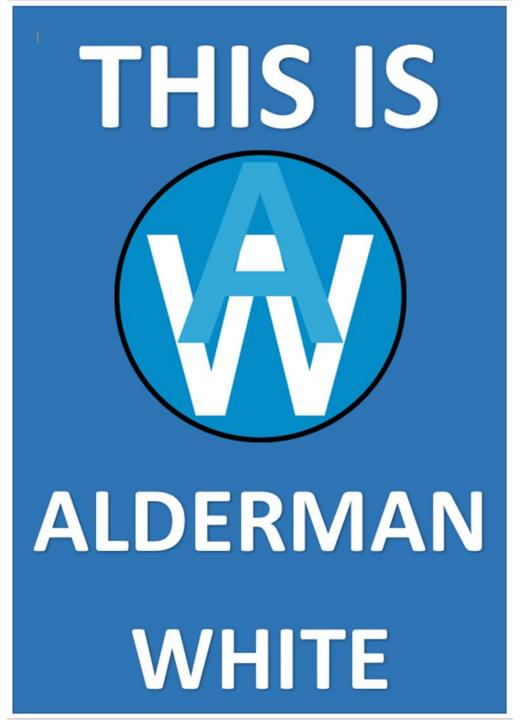

What is the difference between year 8 and 9?

- Expectations of maturity and academic rigour.
- Focus on thinking about the future (GCSE subjects and careers).
- Some curriculum content will cover GCSE material.
- Groupings have changed for English and Maths.
- Media Studies is taught by a specialist as a stand-alone subject.
- Breaks and lunches are at different times.

Specialisms process

All students do:

- ✓ Maths GCSE
- ✓ English Language and English Literature GCSE
- ✓ Science GCSE Combined worth 2 GCSEs or Triple (3 GCSEs Biology, Chemistry, Physics)
- ✓ Core PE and Personal Development

We encourage all students to take:

✓a Language GCSE

Students select:

- ✓a Humanities subject (History, Geography or RE)
- ✓ 2 other specialisms (this can include Triple Science and / or a 2nd Humanities subject)



The process runs across the Spring term:

- ✓ Specialisms booklets are usually emailed out just before the end of the Autumn term.
- ✓ Students have sessions in Personal Development and lessons
- ✓ A Meet the Professionals careers event
- ✓ Written reports (17th January)
- ✓ Specialisms Evening and English /
 Maths / Science parents evening (6th
 February)
- ✓ Deadline for online form after February half term
- ✓ No news is good news
- ✓ Letter confirming specialisms before May half term

Active learners

- listen attentively to instructions and explanations
- do their best to complete each activity to a good standard

Passive learners

- sit quietly during teacher instructions and explanations
- do not hinder or disrupt the learning of others
- do not develop their work to the level they are capable of
- may make a limited contribution to paired or group work

Inconsistent learners

 listen attentively and do their best to complete activities to a good standard some but not all of the time

Disengaged learners

- struggle to listen attentively or complete learning activities to an acceptable standard
- need guidance from the teacher to meet classroom expectations

Attendance

We aim for all students to achieve at least 96% attendance over the school year.

- 90% attendance = half a day missed every week.
- 90% attendance in one school year = 4 whole weeks of lessons missed in that year.
- 90% attendance over 5 years of secondary school = half a year of school missed.
- Evidence suggests that, on average, 17 days of school missed in a year (92% attendance) equates to a potential drop of <u>1 GCSE grade</u>

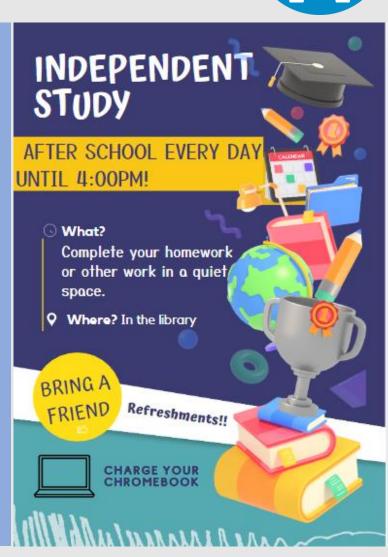
Some key reminders:

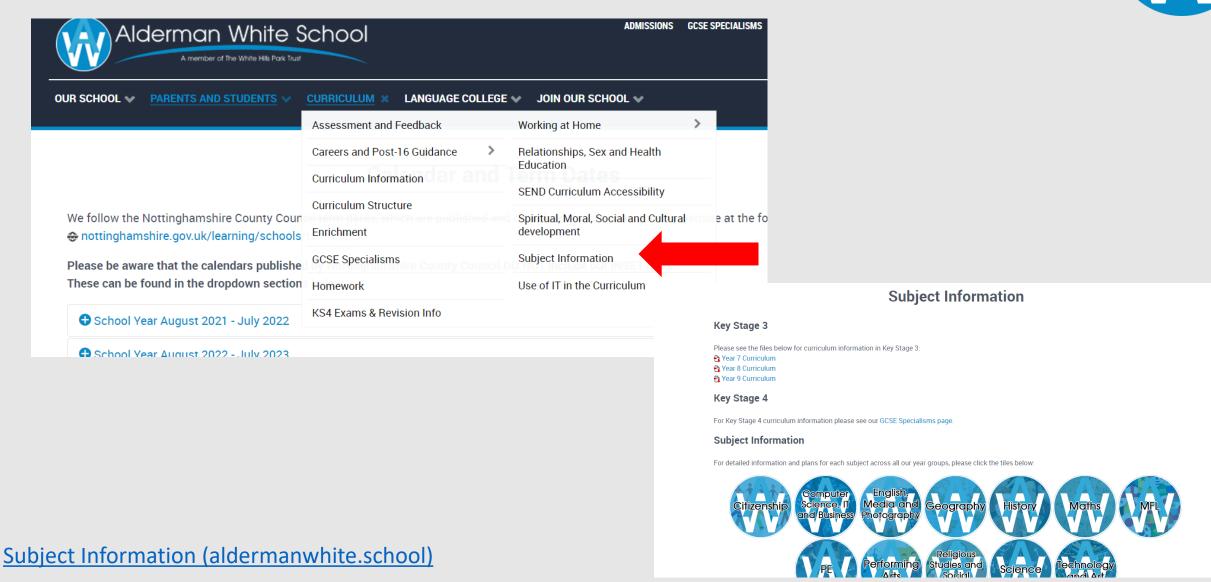

Grouping Information

- Mainly in tutor groups most specialism subjects are taught in mixed attainment groups in year 10-11!
- English and Maths are now taught in new mixed groups preparation for not being in tutor groups in Year 10-11
- Languages depends on the Language selected (1 Mandarin, 1 German and 2 French groups in each half of the year)
- PE 2 single sex and 1 mixed male and female group in each year half
 speak to us if any issues; all activities risk assessed and appropriate
 (GCSE PE = 1 mixed sex group)
- Technology mixed attainment smaller groups





• The English curriculum this year is focused on a range of modern and 19th century texts, so that students can read and write confidently, fluently and with enthusiasm.

- English lessons are focused on building students' independence and stamina so that they are well equipped for Key Stage 4.
- As students no longer have library lessons, you can help by ensuring that they have a book for DEAR time and that they are getting through a book every 2-3 weeks. Reading independently will help across all subjects.





- Students begin the GCSE Maths content in Year 9, which allows students to complete the GCSE course early in Year 11 to allow plenty of revision time.
- Maths classes are mixed attainment but regular extension opportunities are provided to stretch and challenge students.
- We continue to enter the UKMT Maths Challenge Competition each year – various students in Year 9 have been highly successful in this previously.

Assessment in Year 9



- Lots of low stakes quizzing and formative assessments.
- Termly or half-termly assessment tasks across subjects, which take place in lesson time.
- Each assessment is followed by target-tackling to help students improve their grade.
- Towards the end of Year 9, assessments will be used to inform setting in certain subjects.
- One end of year assessment will be in the Sports Hall / exam rooms (to prepare for Year 10-11).

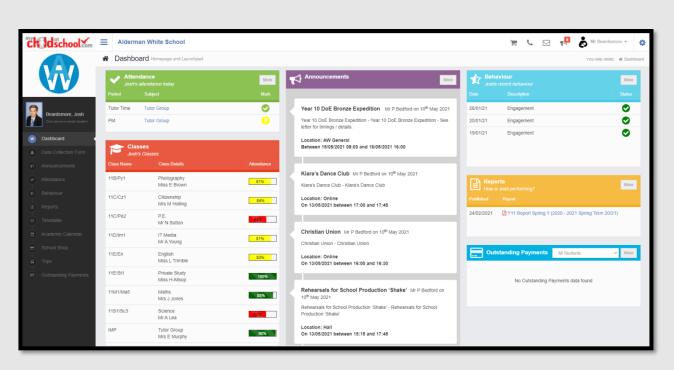

Google Classroom

All lesson material and homework is here. Once you've accepted the Google Classroom invitation for guardian summaries, you will receive an email either daily or weekly listing student's homework assignments.

School Cloud

All online parent's evenings are booked and hosted through School Cloud. Your login details will be details about you and your child. More information is sent out when an event is approaching.

Student Portal

This is for your child and details all the things students need to know including timetable, reports, rewards and more.

Chromebook scheme



- All students in school to have access to a device to use in the classroom and at home.
- Opportunity to purchase a device at a subsidised rate (£100 non-pp, £50 pp), loan a
 device or bring your home device from home.
- Please re-enforce that students should fully charge their Chromebook ready for each school day, and use the carrycases provided to prevent breakages to screens.
- Screen repair can be done in school and paid for using MCAS (£25).
- School should be made aware of any issues as soon as possible so a loan device can be allocated whilst investigation/repair takes place.
- We only monitor Chromebooks in school. It is parent's responsibility to monitor student use of Chromebooks outside school hours.
