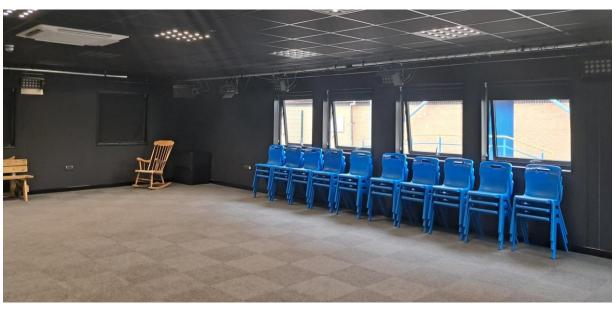

Parent Survey 2024 (178 responses)

- ✓ Range of subjects available (94%)

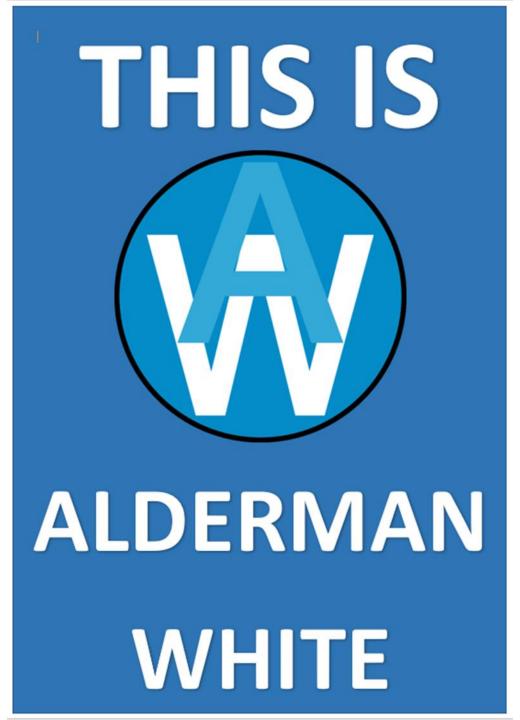
It lives its values

Attendance

We aim for all students to achieve at least 96% attendance over the school year.

- 90% attendance = half a day missed every week.
- 90% attendance in one school year = 4 whole weeks of lessons missed in that year.
- 90% attendance over 5 years of secondary school
 half a year of school missed.
- Evidence suggests that, on average, every 17 days of school missed by a student equates to a potential drop of <u>1 GCSE grade</u>

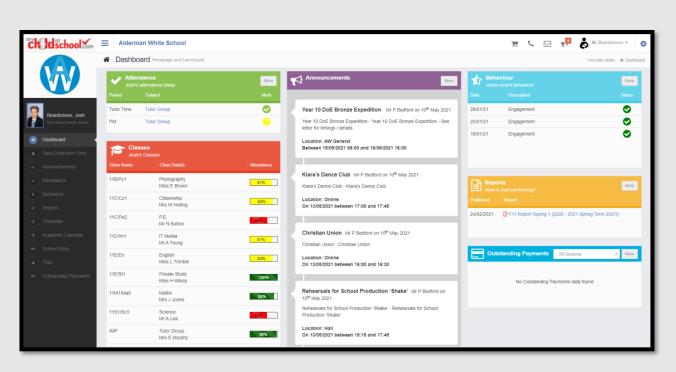

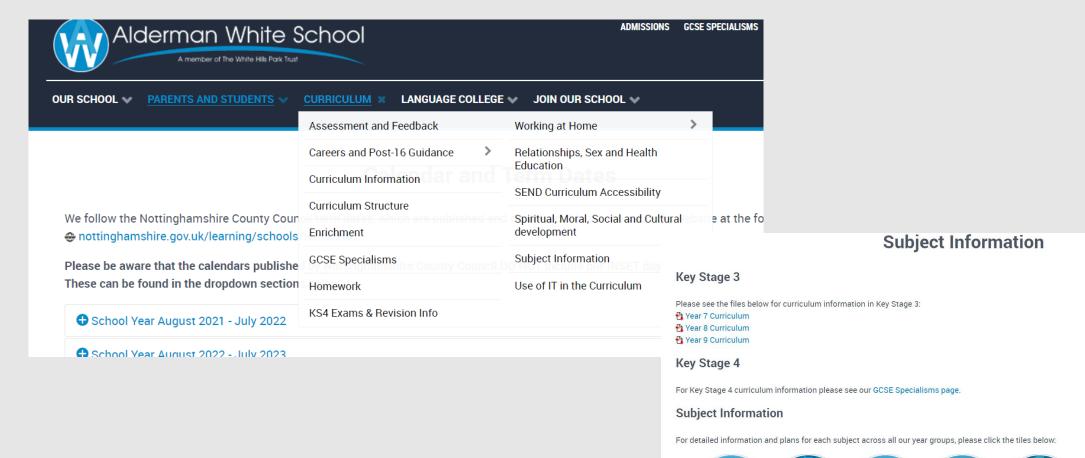

English



The link between good reading and good grades is higher in Maths than in some arts subjects like English Literature and History.

Students need a book every day because:

- A library lesson every week where students are supported to choose books that are enjoyable, achievable and give enough challenge
- DEAR time every day in tutor time and at the start of Period
- Reading homework: 20 minutes each day, which is checked through completion of online quizzes. We expect students to complete a reading quiz every 2-3 weeks.

The Library is open most breaks and lunchtimes and after school (until 4pm) to support reading and homework.

How to support at home

If your child finds reading difficult, please find time to listen to them. As they read:

Prompt – what do you think that word means?

Evaluate – that's right / not quite.

Expand – which other words are like that word?

Repeat – let's read that word again.

If your child is a more confident reader, talk to them. Ask:

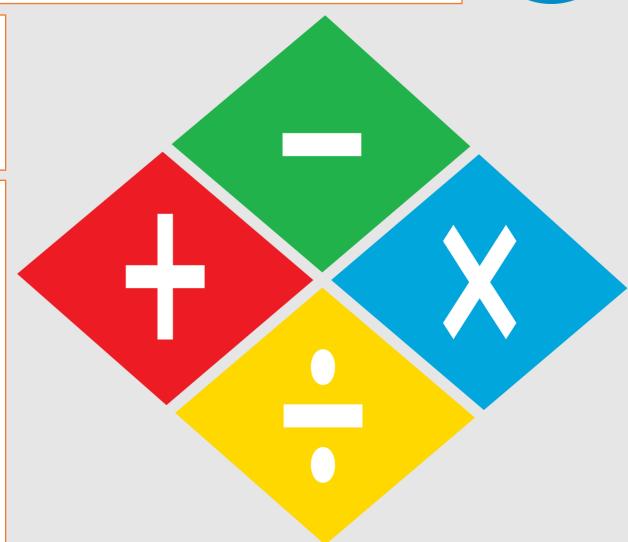
- What can they remember of the ... plot, character, setting?
- What are their ideas about plot, character, setting?
- Does the character remind them of anything?
- Did the character make the right decision?
 What would your child have done? What could the character have done differently?

Maths



We see Maths as a collaborative subject and nourish confidence through celebrating effort and contribution as well as attainment. Effective dialogue, discussion and high-quality questioning & oracy are at the heart of our approach to teaching & learning.

- ✓ Pupils are taught topics in two-week blocks with a deep focus on relevant skills and their applications.
- ✓ Links are made to other topics in problem-solving tasks and significant consideration is given to interleaving skills to ensure long-term retention.



Groupings



- Students are taught in mixed attainment tutor groups in Year 7 and 8 for most subjects
- Ability grouping increases as students move through the school, although every class includes students with a range of abilities and skills!
- MFL 4 groups do French, German and Mandarin, 2 groups do French and Mandarin – students select 1 Language from Year 9
- PE 2 single sex and 1 mixed male and female group in each year half speak to us if any issues; all activities risk assessed and appropriate
- Technology smaller mixed attainment practical groups
- If your child is finding the work too easy or too hard, or struggling to make progress in their class, they should speak to the teacher, or you can contact their tutor or Progress Leader who will get the Curriculum Leader to contact you.

Year 8 Homework

English, Maths, Science

1 piece per week (approx. 30 minutes)

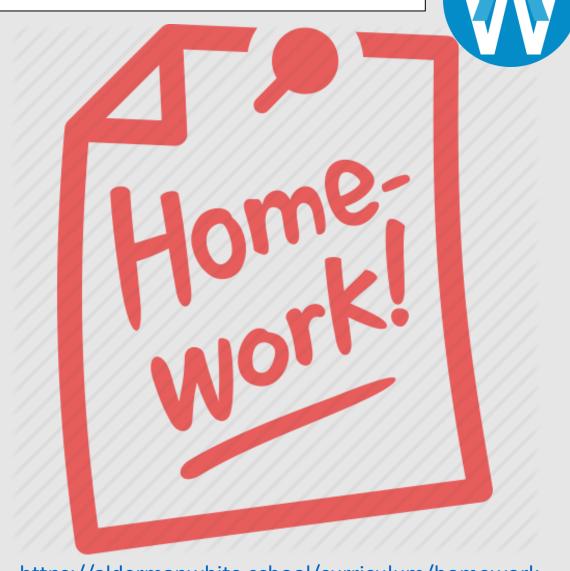
History, Geography, RE, French, German, Mandarin, Computer Science, Art, Music, Drama, Technology

1 piece per fortnight (20-30 minutes) or 1 piece per 4 weeks (30-40 minutes)

Deadlines: Minimum of 4 days

Homework club each day after school in the library.
