Dear Parent/Carer,

Thank you for all of your support this half-term. We have had a very busy and productive eight weeks!

Welcoming our new students, staff and parents

Our Year 7 students have settled in very well, and over 80 of them are finishing off the half-term with a 2 night residential at Walesby Forest with their tutors. In addition, we have welcomed a number of other students into Year 8 - 10. Our new staff have also settled into school life very well — we have all found the school community very welcoming and friendly.

Working hard towards exam success in Key Stage 4 and beyond

Our Year 10 students have made an excellent start to their Key Stage 4 courses. Year 11 students have taken mock exams in Science, English Language and Maths and are using their results to improve their grades further. The main mock exam period starts on Monday 19th November; students have been given a copy of the exam timetable and can access information about what they need to do to prepare from M:\7. Exam Revision\Y11 Mocks 2018 on the school system. We look forward to meeting parents of Year 11 students at Year 11 Parents Evening on Thursday 15th November.

Year 11 students have also been looking at post-16 providers and routes in their Citizenship lessons and I know many students have been visiting 6th forms and colleges and starting to consider their plans for next year and beyond. Any student applying to Bramcote College 6th Form (BC6F) will be offered a one to one discussion to support them in choosing the most appropriate Key Stage 5 courses. All Year 11 students will be offered a Career Interview with our Careers Guidance provider, Ideas4Careers.

Extra-Curricular Opportunities

Since the start of term students have been involved in the Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award expedition, German exchange visit, Madrid trip and Year 7 Walesby Forest residential. Students are busy rehearsing for our whole school production of Romeo and Juliet and the Swing Band, Orchestra, Choir and other music ensembles are preparing for our Christmas concert. Most year groups have had sports fixtures, and lots of students have taken part in our weekly extracurricular programme, in addition to the activities and groups that many of them are involved with out of school.

Our Year 8 students are now signing up for the Hagg Farm residential later in the year, and we have had a record number of Year 9 students apply for our Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award. Our D of E Team are working hard to accommodate as many students as possible without diluting the quality of the experience. We will be contacting Year 9 students and parents as soon as possible to update you on our plans. It would be helpful if Year 9 students who have applied can start thinking about their skill, volunteering and physical activities as these need to be completed prior to the expedition.

Student Leadership

Many of our students have really contributed to leading aspects of our school this term. This includes our Senior Students, led by Lead Students Anna Robertson and Patrick Slater, as well as our School Council representatives. Other students are volunteering as Year 9 and 10 Maths Mentors, BBC School News Reporters, or being trained as Sports Leaders. Congratulations to William Mee who has been elected as Broxtowe Youth Mayor and Faraz Hussain as Deputy Youth Mayor. Our students have done a wonderful job of showing prospective parents and students what our school is all about, both by volunteering at Open Evening and welcoming the many visitors who have toured the school over the past few weeks. The feedback has been extremely positive, and it is always our students' enthusiasm and engagement that impresses visitors the most.

I have been both delighted and humbled by the number of parents who are so committed to supporting us as a school. We are very lucky to have a great team leading the PTA who would love to have new volunteers to support the events they have planned for the second half of this term.
