Thank you so much for your support in enabling such a positive start to the school year. I already feel very proud to be Head of this wonderful school, and would like to thank the staff, students and school community for making me feel so welcome. Our new starters in Year 7 and our other year groups have settled in very well, and our older students are being excellent role models in their focus on learning and conduct around school. I would like to welcome new parents to the Alderman White community, as well as our new staff – Mr J Allsopp (History), Mr J Barker (English), Miss C Leyland (Science), Mr R Chapman (Maths), Mrs N Sharma (Temporary Teacher of English) as well as Mr R Subbarao who has joined us from Bramcote College. ### **Summer Success**

The Alderman White Class of 2018 yet again surpassed expectations with a stunning set of exam results. 66% of students achieved a Grade 4 or above in both English and Maths, with 48% achieving a 5 or above, both above the national average. 21% of all results were grade 7-9, and one of our students was among the 732 nationally who achieved Grade 9s across the board. Well done to the Alderman White class of 2018!

# **School Routines**

Thank you for your support in ensuring that your son/daughter arrives at school on time by 8.45am, in full uniform, and with the equipment they need. Establishing these routines is important in developing good learner habits and employability skills for the future. Our website contains the details of these expectations, although sometimes clarification is required as fashions change. Please can I take this opportunity to clarify that socks should be ankle rather than trainer socks, and plain black, as stated on the school website.
