## German Exchange: Welcoming students from Gütersloh

Over the last week, our schools have welcomed 16 students from the Städtische Gymnasium in Gütersloh, Germany for the UK leg of the annual exchange visit. The students will spend 10 days here, staying with host families and experiencing life in Nottinghamshire. They are accompanied by Mr. Brayley, who has visited us many times and is a great friend to our schools, and Ms. Grosseschallau, who is on her first exchange visit. I am delighted that this year we have students from both of our schools taking part, so that this is an event that permeates across the whole of the Trust.

The German Exchange has been part of our school life for well over 3 decades – lifelong friendships have been formed and countless students have learnt about another culture and language. The bonds between our schools have become very strong. I had the privilege of visiting a couple of years ago, and was overwhelmed by the warmth of the welcome I received. It was fascinating to talk to see around a German school, and talk to teachers and students about their experiences of education and schooling.

Mr Stephan has put together a varied and fascinating programme for our guests. By the time they return to Germany, they will have visited London,

Stratford-upon-Avon (students outside Shakespeare's pictured birthplace), the Black Country Museum in Dudley and Alton Towers. They will have been bowling, had a disco evening and spent time in Nottingham with their host families. They have met with the Mayor of Broxtowe, Councillor Michael Brown, who officially welcomed them to the borough. I'm sure they will take back many memories and some great photos.



However, I suspect that the days they spend in school will be among their most memorable. They have taken part in normal lessons, spent time around the school at break and lunch times, and got a feel for life as a young person in the UK. I know our students have made them feel very welcome., and our visitors always find it fascinating to experience different styles of teaching and learning.

I would like to give a special mention to the host families, who show such generosity and warmth every year. It can be a daunting experience for a young person to stay with a family you have never met before in a strange country, but by the end of the visit, the students are always very sad to say goodbye, and appreciative of the way they have been looked after. I am also very grateful to Mr Stephan for his leadership of the visits, ably supported by Ms Dalton.

Obviously, the exchange is a great opportunity to develop language skills, and knowledge of a different culture. We know that our students benefit hugely from the German leg of the exchange in February in this regard. However, the importance of the exchange runs deeper. It reinforces some absolutely crucial values that we want our school communities to embody. We are an open and welcoming community, and we place huge value on the spirit of friendship with people from other countries. Although the world is a big place, these friendships can make it feel a little smaller, and our bonds a little stronger.

This message runs through many of the special things we do, including the exchange with Jiangshan School in Ningbo, and our many international visits, as well as the work we do with the students who come to our schools from overseas. I am delighted that our latest exchange has been such a success, and look forward to many more memorable visits in the future.
