

Parents' Forums

Yesterday evening, we held this term's Parents' Forum at Alderman White. The subjects discussed ranged from the sugar content of the drinks sold in the canteen to the preparation for Year 11 exams. As ever, we had a large and well-informed group of parents and carers who were there to find out more and raise issues, but always in a spirit of collaboration and partnership.

Both schools run a Parents' Forum, and the next one at Bramcote College will be held on November 20th. (Amongst other topics, we will be able to share the designs for the new school building at this meeting). They were originally set up several years ago to give a way for parents to discuss issues that were not necessarily directly related to their child, but that related to school policy or performance in a wider context. They have always been somewhere where honest and open dialogue can take place, and they are highly valued by school leadership teams as an opportunity to have direct communication and feedback.

Over the years, the views of parents and carers have been influential on decisions the school has taken on many issues, such as homework, the graduation system, trips and enrichment activity, uniform and so on. We know how engaged and supportive our parents are and welcome the spirit that has developed between school and home. I hope that your experience of our schools is that we are keen to communicate with you and work in partnership, whatever the issue.

We are very aware of the importance of parental engagement on student outcomes – study after study has shown the correlation between parents' positive involvement in their child's schooling and excellent rates of progress, stronger than almost any other factor. Parents and carers are the first and most important educators of their children, and all of our success is built upon your work. The attendance at Parents' Evenings or at events such as the 'Help your child succeed in exams' evening show the keen interest that parents and carers show in their child's progress. We saw another example yesterday at Bramcote College, with parents of Year 7 students visiting for a coffee and a chance to meet informally with staff, establishing relationships that will be so important over the coming years.

We are also grateful for the way our parents and carers support us in many other ways – our parent governors, our amazing PTAs, your attendance at shows, concerts and sporting fixtures and so on. Later this year, we will be carrying out another parent survey, and we will be very keen to hear your views.

Christmas is coming!


Bramcote College PTA would like to remind you that there are just 75 days until Christmas ... over the past few weeks Year 7,

Our next fixture will be against Kesteven and Grantham Girls School in Round 3.


