

### **Ethical Leadership**

On Thursday, I had the pleasure of attending the Ethical Leadership Summit at the London University Institute of Education. This was an event at which teachers, governors and school leaders reinforced their commitment to

ensuring that their schools act with integrity, underpinned with strong values. Representatives from schools and Trusts across the country talked about the way that they had responded to some of the ethical challenges that they had faced, and how they were embedding good practice in their schools.



About 2 years ago, a group of organisations involved in education, including the National Governors' Association, the Chartered College of Teaching, professional associations, Ofsted and voluntary sector educational bodies, set up the Ethical Leadership Commission to establish guiding principles for educational leaders. The Commission subsequently produced a report 'Navigating the Educational Moral Maze', which created a great deal of interest in the educational community.



The heart of the report set out the 'Framework for Ethical Leadership in FRAMEWORK FOR 'Framework for Ethical Leadership in ETHICAL LEADERSHIP Education'. This brought together a set of principles and virtues that define ethical behaviour in schools.

They are the principles of Selflessness, Integrity, Objectivity, Accountability, Openness, Honesty and Leadership, and the virtues of Trust, Wisdom, Kindness, Justice, Service, Courage and Optimism.

At the White Hills Park Trust, we are fully supportive of these principles and virtues, and we have become a Pathfinder for the Framework. This means that the way we act should conform to these aspirations and that is the standard to which we hold ourselves. Our Trustees have committed to the framework as the way we will measure all of our work.

In a complex organization like a school there are many difficult dilemmas that face us - how do we allocate finite resources in the best way possible? How do we ensure that we have a broad curriculum whilst preparing students as well as possible for their exams? How do we design behaviour systems to balance high standards with individual needs? There are rarely simple answers and we cannot be certain that we always make the right call, but we try and make sure we act wisely and with integrity.

# Alderman White Students take part in the Broxtowe Borough Council Holocaust Memorial Ceremony

This Monday 27th January, members of the Broxtowe community came together to mark the 75th anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz as part of the annual Holocaust Memorial Day. The short ceremony in the walled garden in Bramcote Hills Park was led by Mayor of Broxtowe, Councillor Michael Brown, who was joined by Youth Mayor Grace Li, local faith-leaders, the Leader of Broxtowe Council, Milan Radulovic MBE and Alderman White students Ellie Boyce (Y9) and Judah Thurgood (Y8) who poignantly captured the day's theme 'Stand Together' with their very well received reading of pastor Martin Niemoeller's speech:

First they came for the Communists And I did not speak out Because I was not a Communist

Then they came for the trade unionists And I did not speak out Because I was not a trade unionist

Then they came for the Jews And I did not speak out Because I was not a Jew
