

Feedback from Parents

You will recall that at the end of last term, we invited parents to take part in our parent survey. Thank you so much for those who took the time to do so, your feedback is extremely valuable. We had 160 responses, split roughly equally between the schools. We have collected the results by school and will make them available via individual schools. I would encourage you to take the time to look at them in detail. Although there is a great deal of consistency, the leadership teams from both schools will be carrying out their own analysis and responses.

Across the Trust there were some key patterns that I can share with you. Firstly, we are very pleased that the vast majority of respondents are extremely pleased with the performance of our schools, with an average positive response rate close to 90%. Areas in which parents were particularly complimentary included whether their child was happy and safe in school, the quality of extra-curricular activity and the range of subjects studied. There were also very positive responses to questions about behaviour, progress, communication and personal development. A large majority of parents reported that their child had not been bullied, but on the occasions where this had happened, most parents consider that the school dealt with the bullying quickly and effectively.

Whilst a high positive response rate is good news for us, we are also conscious that until it reaches 100% then there are some parents who have concerns, and so we will try and respond to those concerns. To that end, the comments made at the end of the survey are particularly valuable. Although they are anonymous, they give us some idea of where parents think we are performing particularly well, but also how we can improve. Please be assured that feedback from parents is a crucial part of the information we use to plan our next steps.

Obviously, this is only one way that we find out your views and suggestions. The Parents Forum at both schools is invaluable and we are always happy to hear from you via email or phone if there is something you wish to discuss. We know that a true partnership between home and school is among the most important factors in your child's success.

Good communication is a two-way process, of course. We try and make sure that our communication with you is prompt, helpful and detailed. As well as our weekly Newsletter, letters from the school and school/Trust websites, we use social media to give regular information about school activities - links can be found on our websites. We also encourage parents to visit your child's Go4Schools page to see information about progress, homework, behaviour and attendance, as well as the most recent annual reports.
